# Guide to the 2010 Perceptions of the Voting Experience Survey

## PART I

## INTRODUCTION

The 2010 Perceptions of the Voting Experience Survey seeks to understand Americans' perceptions of the voting experience, of both individuals who do and do not vote. Interviews were conducted immediately after the 2010 election, from December 7 to 30, 2010. The data file contains 3,000 interviews (cases), which were matched to responses from the 2010 Cooperative Congressional Election Study (CCES) Common Content, a collaborative effort among researchers headed by principal investigator Stephen Ansolabehere. ${ }^{2}$

This guide describes the methodology behind the study and the measures and variables developed for the survey. There are four parts to the survey content: (1) questions that were asked of all 3,000 respondents, (2) questions that were asked of only 1,185 respondents ("Form A"), (3) questions that were asked of only 1,815 respondents ("Form B"), and (4) variables from the 2010 CCES Common Content.

## SAMPLING METHODOLOGY

The survey was conducted over the Internet by YouGov/Polimetrix.
YouGov interviewed 3,507 respondents who had taken both waves of the 2010 Cooperative Congressional Election Study (CCES). These interviews were then matched on gender, age, race, education, party identification, ideology, and political interest down to a sample of 3,000 to produce the final dataset. YouGov then weighted the matched set of survey respondents to known marginals for the citizen population of the United States age 25+ from the 2008 American Community Survey (ACS). (Those marginals are shown below.) Thus, the final weighted dataset $(\mathrm{N}=3,000)$ is meant to be representative of the U.S. adult population (age 25 and over).

The original CCES sample was constructed by first drawing a target population sample. For the 2010 CCES, this target sample is based on the 2008 ACS, November 2008 Current Population Survey Supplement, and the 2007 Pew Religious Life Survey. Thus, the target sample is representative of the general population on a broad range of characteristics including a variety of geographic (state, region, metropolitan statistical area), demographic (age, race, income, education, gender), and other measures (born-again status, employment, interest in news, party identification, ideology, and turnout). A stratified sample of individuals from Polimetrix's opt-in panel (PollingPoint Panel and the E-Rewards and Western Wats panels) was invited to participate in the study. The final set of completed pre-election interviews were then matched to the target frame, using a weighted Euclidean distances metric. ## PART II

## SURVEY STRUCTURE

The Perceptions of the Voting Experience Survey consisted of three sets of questions: (1) questions asked of all $(3,000)$ respondents; $(2)$ questions asked of approximately $40 \%(1,185)$ of the respondents ("Form A"); and (3) questions asked of approximately $60 \%(1,815)$ of the respondents ("Form B"). The main difference between Form A and Form B is that Form A asked respondents a few questions about their relationship with a variety of groups (e.g., family, friends and neighbors, co-workers) as it pertains to the voting experience, whereas Form B asked respondents more, and more detailed, questions about a single group. Part III of this document provides question wording and coding information for all variables, separated by form. The entries take the following form:
(Variable Name) yal142
(Special Programming Instructions) This is an experiment. With 1/3 probability respondents should be randomly assigned to the "politics" or "sports" or "religion" condition.
(Variable Type) SINGLE CHOICE
(Variable Label) Lost a friend
(Question Text) Has a disagreement over [politics / sports / religion] ever resulted in you losing a friend?
